### Director's Notes

When I was 16 my high school theatre teacher chose "Little Shop of Horrors" as our big annual play. I was invited to assistant direct and working on this play changed my life. Two theatre degrees later and I still credit those weeks of rehearsal as the most formative years of my career. To get the opportunity to take another stab at it 15 years later and put my own touch on it has been a true gift. When I approached this script again in our current time and place I couldn't help but see the parallel between an alien plant sent to Earth to colonize and destroy and the pervasive issue of invasive species in Hawaii and the impact these foreign plants have on the environment and native plants. I hope this production piques your interest in researching and protecting Hawaii's indigenous plants and culture from overwhelming invasive forces. As we're told in the final number of the show, "If we fight it we've still got a chance, but whatever they offer you, don't feed the plants!"
